For several years he worked directly with the Peace Corps, project managing the renewal of their Haitian headquarters. Over the last 15 years, in addition to ongoing engineering and management contributions to the City and State of New York, Jude and his schedulers have also managed to find the time for him to participate in various philanthropic organizations. This

commitment reflects his belief that learning, sharing knowledge, and volunteering aid in the enrichment of both society and self.
